As an aquatic biologist at the California Academy of Sciences' Steinhart Aquarium, Pamela Schaller is part of a team which cares for more than 38,000 live animals. Schaller serves as the primary biologist for the Academy's charismatic colony of endangered African penguins. She is also responsible for the husbandry of an array of species, including blacktip and whitetip reef sharks, alligator gars, and dog-faced fruit bats.

Leading up to the opening of the Academy's new facility in 2008, Schaller helped design new live animal exhibits, and execute the monumental move of thousands of fish, sharks, turtles, birds and other animals into temporary quarters, and later to their new homes. Prior to joining the Academy, Schaller worked with exotic animals including reticulated giraffes and zebras at the Honolulu Zoo, and as an educator at several science centers.
